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FROM THE DESK OF THE PRESIDENT

The Ad Hoc Rules and Regulations Committee is very close to completing the revision of our *Rules and Regulations*. The committee will present it to the Board for approval and then send the document to our attorney for his recommendations. The committee has dealt with every section of the document and how it impacts living in Oakwood Manor. The committee intends that the revisions we are proposing represent what is in the best interest of all our residents.

Even though the revised *Rules and Regulations* are not ready for distribution, I want to take the time in this column to review some points of importance and concern to our residents under the heading: Vehicles, Traffic & Trailers. For the purpose of this column, I'm extending it to include Pedestrians and anything with wheels.

As you know, we are a private community; however, because Oakwood Manor is within the City of Sarasota, its traffic and motor codes apply to us. For a community of our size, the speed limit is 20 mph. We have posted speed limit signs and painted the speed limit on the road surface of many streets. And, yet vehicles still speed. What would it take for our community to adhere to the speed limit? It's as simple as realizing that we are a community of folks who care about one another and would not want to endanger anyone by speeding or blowing through stop signs. Yes, not coming to a complete stop at a stop sign can also endan-

ger residents; yet some drivers are careless and do not come to a complete stop. Near misses have happened. Let us never have to deal with a tragedy. All of us can ensure safe streets if we adhere to 2 simple rules: 20 mph speed limit and stopping at stop signs.

If you need to park your vehicle on the street, make sure you park *with* the flow of traffic and not opposite another vehicle parked on the other side of the street. In case of an emergency, a fire truck or ambulance would not be able to get through if vehicles are parked opposite one another.

Often we see residents on bicycles. Great exercise! Like anything else with wheels, ride your bike *with* traffic and make sure, if you're riding at night, that you have head and tail lights turned on.

We also see lots of walkers. Great exercise, too! Walk *against* traffic so that you'll see traffic approaching and not just hope the driver sees you. Always use a flashlight when walking at night to make sure the driver sees you.

May this month's column serve as a reminder that rules have a purpose; in this case, to keep us safe as we drive, bike or walk around our slice of paradise, Oakwood Manor.

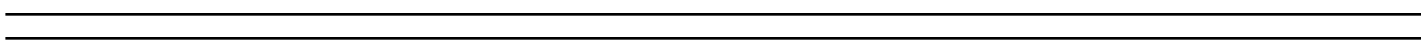

Happy St. Patrick's Day

Oakwood Members

1. The lift station that services the pool bathrooms went down earlier this month. This is an Oakwood responsibility. All other lift stations in OM are The City of Sarasota responsibility. After a diagnosis the two pumps needed replacement. This occurred on February 7th at a cost of \$7,600.00 to the association.
2. Monster Tree was on site for 6 days with a crew of 6 to clean up dead branches in the trees and 6 dead palm trees. This was needed due to Hurricane Milton. Cost - \$42,600. **Our stump removal happened yesterday at a cost of \$2,420. This brings the total for tree services due to Hurricane Milton at \$160,5200.**
3. Florida Southern Roofing has been out to make effective repairs to the clubhouse roof. **The cost of \$2,315.83 is well BE-LOW our deductible.**
4. A new vendor for our A/C maintenance has been initiated and will save the association around \$1,000 a year. Badger Bob is out, and Gary Air is in. Before the ink dried on the contract a service call was made to address no air in the office. A technician was out the following day and made necessary repairs at a cost of \$170. Regular services on the 12 A/C units at the clubhouse were done last week.
5. The two backflow units at the entrance of the clubhouse had their annual inspections last week. There was some minor repair work needed on the 2" device.
6. The fire alarm system received its annual inspection and passed with flying colors.
7. Oakwood Manor has engaged Jakusovas & Company, P.L. to perform an audit of 2024 financials at a cost of \$3,600.
8. We have signed a contract with USA Fence to make repairs or replacements on 1,000 FT of perimeter fencing. The cost for the completed project is estimated at \$27,000.
9. As soon as the date is set a message will be posted on Channel 2.
9. I have received 2 quotes for a gazebo kit. If the Board wishes to proceed with a replacement, there are funds to accommodate this expenditure. **This will be a March agenda item at the Board Meeting.**
10. I have received 3 quotes for repairs or replacement of the bocce ball structure. A fourth was received this morning and I have yet to evaluate the proposal. **This item was briefly discussed at the February Board Meeting and then TABLED until March to digest the fourth quote that came late.**
11. I had the well-pump serviced for \$350.00 due to damage from Hurricane Milton.
12. The lake irrigation pump has been out of commission for 2 years. This pump wasn't needed until Hurricane Milton knocked out the well pump. We had no irrigation for 2 months until the well was able to be restored. I have a proposal to restore the lake pump. I believe this will be money well spent to use lake water when water levels are high instead of using the well and having a redundant system again. Costs will be \$5,209.00. **This item was approved by the Board at the February meeting and will be completed by the time you read this.**
13. **The rear gate access has finally been repaired and is operating smoothly. There were three different issues caused by Hurricane Milton and it took a lot of work to diagnose each issue.**
14. Our scheduled update to our Reserve Study has been completed by Reserve Advisors. I have a copy for all Board Members today. I will have loaner copies available for members to borrow. My initial take of the report is that we are in good shape for future Reserve expenses.
15. I have received 3 proposals for paving the maintenance area after the Certificate of Occupancy is issued and we move all our equipment and materials into the new building. **The Board approved a contract with Asphalt Maintenance for a cost of \$18,820.00.**

TREASURER'S REPORT

Our net income for the month of January was (\$41,252.87). This result was largely due to the tree trimming expense which came in at \$45,145.27. We also had to replace both pumps in our lift station at the club house which totaled \$7,900.

The contract of repairing the fence was initiated as \$13,000 and was paid in January to begin the process of repairing the fence which is estimated at \$26,000.

We are waiting on depreciation information from the accountants to close out our year end 2024.

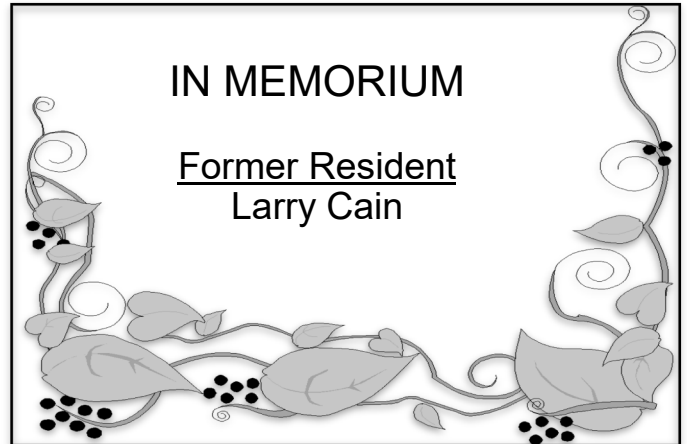
