Thank you, Oakwood Manor homeowners, who attended our Annual Membership Meeting and Board Organizational Meeting in January. As you know, a quorum of 324 is required to hold the Annual Membership Meeting and we received a total of 409 proxies. The one ballot issue that was voted on and approved by the membership was to carry over the operating budget surplus from 2024 to 2025 to avoid paying any unnecessary federal taxes on the surplus.

In my November column I mentioned that an ad hoc Rules and Regulations Committee had been set up to review and revise the *Rules and Regulations*. The committee is chaired by Tony Calvino. Committee members are Paula Bolland, Ramona Evans, Al LaForge, Lori Reimann, Sherrie Reynolds and me. Once we complete our revisions, the committee will present its recommendations to the Board. Our attorney will then review the document before

the Board can make its final decision. As you can see, this is a several step process, and the committee has been very diligent in its work to make sure we follow State and City statutes that govern some of our *Rules and Regulations*.

Our gazebo, a treasured meeting place in the Park, was demolished by Hurricane Milton. Plans to build a new gazebo are under discussion and will be announced when they are finalized. As soon as we have permission to occupy the Maintenance Building, look for an announcement to join us at the Grand Opening.

As we move into 2025, you can look forward to all the activities you have come to expect from living in Oakwood Manor. Maybe this year you'll participate in activities that are new for you, or you'll be interested in opportunities to volunteer your time and talent. Your involvement not only enhances your own life, it contributes to all of us who consider Oakwood Manor our home.

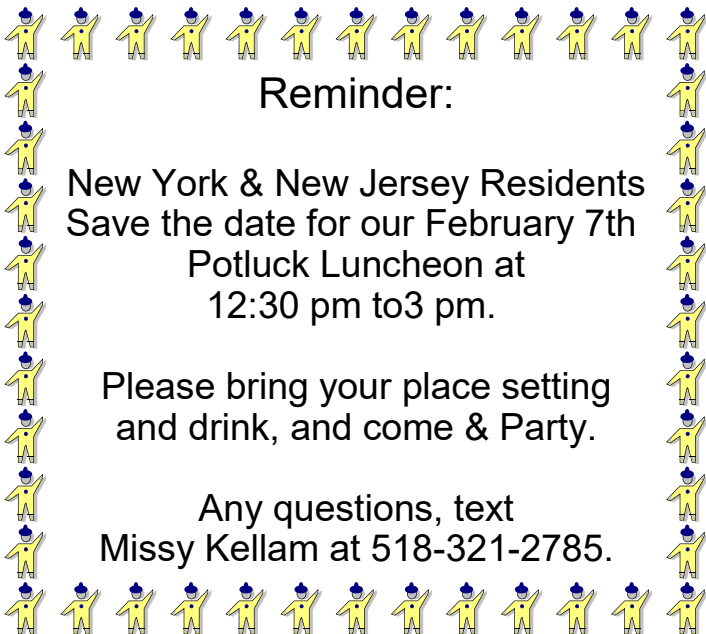

MANAGER'S CORNER

Annual Manager's Report January 13, 2025

Happy New Year Oakwood Homeowners, 2024 was a year of extremes. We experienced the hottest summer on record this past year. Due to the heat several projects were pushed back to the Fall for completion. Then as you know Sarasota was hit by two major hurricanes, Helene and Milton and a devastating Tropical Storm, Debbie. We still accomplished many projects throughout the year. Here is a list of several of the items done in 2024:

1. Fixed the settling of the banks around the lake. This was at a cost of \$12,000.
2. Completed the refurbishment of the Multi-Purpose Room at a cost of \$26,000.
 - a. Complete ductwork replacement
 - b. Repaired damage to the ceiling from Hurricane Ian.
 - c. Removed all the wiring that was installed for the computer lab configuration
 - d. Removed all fluorescent lighting and replaced with LED lighting.
 - e. Prime and Paint entire room.
3. Upgraded the lighting at the Clubhouse Entrance.
4. Pinnacle Aluminum completed the soffit project around the upper roof due to damage from Hurricane Ian. The final cost was \$60,000.
5. Completed the LED lighting upgrade for the entire Clubhouse, including offices, bathrooms, hall, stage, foyer, kitchen and exercise room.
6. The City of Sarasota lined the main sewer lines on the West side of the park in 2024. The East side is scheduled for 2025.
7. The two gas heaters for the pool were replaced along with 1 heat pump in 2024. 2 heat pumps at the pool will be replaced in 2025.
8. Installed twenty new speed limit signs throughout the property.
9. Installed new signage at the rear entrance. This reduced incidents by more than half.
10. Replaced all scoreboard lights at the shuffleboard courts.
11. Replaced the A/C unit that services the Real Estate office and exercise room.
12. Harley's Tree Services was on the property the day after Hurricane Milton made a direct hit on Sarasota and Oakwood Manor. Harley opened up all roads by the end of that first day. They continued on clearing away the fallen trees for the following 3 weeks. Along with 4 extra landscape debris dumpsters and an aluminum dumpster, we were looking for a lot better by Thanksgiving Holiday. Repairs will continue through 2025, including repairs to over 1,000 Ft of fencing. Repairs of the perimeter lighting and replacement of the soffit at the rear of the Clubhouse.
13. Hurricane Milton knocked out our kiosk for the visitor gate entrance. We were finally able to get it back up and running. All homeowners are encouraged to use their personal codes for vendors and family instead of giving out the monthly code.
14. Replaced over 25 mailboxes that were destroyed for Milton.

2025 PROJECTS ANTICIPATED:

1. Pass the final 2 inspections for the new Maintenance Building. Receive Certificate of Occupancy. Complete the interior build-out. Install new water machine. Install new paving. Have a Grand Opening Ceremony in March.
2. Repair 1,000 ft of perimeter fencing.
3. Repair or replace perimeter lighting as needed when fence repairs are completed.
4. Replace soffit at the rear of the Clubhouse due to Hurricane Milton damage.
5. Install new bollard lights along the east sidewalk at the front of the Clubhouse.
6. Refurbish the hot tub pergola.
7. Replace 2 heat pumps at the pool.
8. Relocate existing ixora plants in the front Clubhouse circle to the west side of the Clubhouse in the spring. Replant new plants in the circle.
9. Refurbish Miniature Golf Course.
10. Update Reserve Study.
11. Receive proposals for repair or replacement of bocce ball court enclosure.
12. Receive proposals for a new gazebo.
